Seasonal water use restricted in Charlottetown

CHARLOTTETOWN, P.E.I. — Seasonal water restrictions are in place until Sept. 30 in Charlottetown.

The mandatory restrictions allow for outdoor watering only in the early morning from 5-10 a.m. or in the evening between 7 p.m. and 1 a.m., to a maximum of two hours per day.

Hosing off driveways and other hard surfaces is also prohibited while the restrictions are in effect.

Restrictions are required to ensure usage does not exceed the city's capacity to supply water.
