
Planted approximately 2,000 trees

• 6km of stream

#### Water monitoring

- <u>Temperature</u> loggers
- <u>Depth loggers</u> which are used to calculate water flow, and also measure temperature
- V-notch weirs were used to continue to monitor spring flows on a bi-weekly basis. Brackley springs had no flow between August and mid December
- Water velocity readings
- Sampling for nitrates from springs and depth logger locations monthly
- Sediment levels were assessed in late fall.

  42 American Eel,
  4 White Perch.










### Plans for 2016/17

#### Field Work:

- Work with Department of Transportation to address problem culverts
- Pruning and maintenance of 17,000 trees.
  - Running low on suitable places to plant with permission
- Work areas identified for stream clearing
  - Exact locations will depend on landowner permission
- Continue water monitoring, with more focus on siltation.
- Establish CABIN monitoring program if funding is found
  - CABIN uses aquatic invertebrates as indicators of ecosystem health




### Plans for 2016/17
